


Tickton C.E. Primary School

Homework is starting up again this week for most of the children in school. YR will join in with reading homework later in the year. It is noticeable that the children who complete their homework regularly benefit from more success with their learning. However, we have reviewed and streamlined what we are asking the children classes to do to make sure that the homework we set is relevant, linked to learning and manageable for the children.

In order to be more sustainable and environmentally friendly, we will no longer be using reading records as these need a lot of paper and the laminated covers cannot be recycled. An explanation of our expectations of homework for each year group is set out in the following table.

Year Groups	Homework Activity	How recorded
1 & 2	Reading 3x weekly	Your child will be given a bookmark for you to tick/date to show that they have read at least three times during the week in order to gain their gold standard award. This is instead of the old style reading records.
3 & 4	Reading (in preparation for lessons)TT Rockstars	By KS2 we know that frequent home reading is embedded and therefore we are not going to ask for evidence of it. We will continue to see your child's fluency and understanding improve as you continue to support them at home. Guided reading homework will still be set weekly however this is the only read that we will dictate as we want your child to read whatever they enjoy!
5 & 6	Reading (in preparation for lessons)My Maths

Homework is set on Seesaw each Friday and is checked the following Friday. Children who complete their homework are given their 'Gold Standard' and are rewarded by taking part in 'Golden Time' which is 20 minutes of a free-choice activity. Children who need to catch up on their homework do so during this free-choice time.



Judo club will be starting up again on Tuesday 12^{th} September from 7.50-8.35am. The club is led by Mr Pete Inman and is open to everyone. There is a cost for this club which is payable directly to Mr Inman. However, if your child has not previously attended the club but is interested and would like to try, they are very welcome to come along for a free taster session; no specialist clothing required, PE kit is fine.

Adventure Photography are coming into school on **Monday 25th September** to take individual photos of the children and groupings of brothers and sisters who are in school. They are also holding a before school session from 8.00am if you would like to bring preschool siblings to be photographed with their brothers & sisters.





Music lessons will be starting again soon. There are places for any children in KS2 to take woodwind or violin lessons and a few places for guitar lessons. Please note that **guitar lessons are for Y4 only**. If your child is interested, please contact the office.

Football Club will be starting after school next Friday, for 6 weeks (15.09 – 20.10.23). Sports Stars Academy will be running this for us again this term. This club is for KS2 children, although places are limited. The cost is £27 for the block. To book, please email sportsstarsacademy@hotmail.com with your child's name, year group, emergency contact number, allergies and any medical conditions.





Art Club will begin after school on Thursday 21st September. This is open to all KS2 children initially but we may have to review this depending on numbers. There is a small cost of £5 per term for materials. We will set this up on School Money after the first club has taken place.
