Please note that confirmation texts will be sent out once the majority of time slots are allocated, which will take a few days, <u>the response will not be immediate</u>.

Raffle tickets have come home with the children this week. Due to last year's demand, we have sent two books of five tickets home with each child. There is no pressure, please only buy the amount you would like; we just ask that you send any unused tickets back into school by Monday 27th November so that we can make them available to parents who are asking for more. If you would like to buy more, or sell them to family, friends and work colleagues, there are a few available from Mrs Buttler in the office.



Festive Fridays are here! Each Friday until the end of term, the children are welcome to wear their Christmas jumpers to school if they wish to do so. Welcome House try to give each child a small bag of age-appropriate, pre-loved gifts. This is very similar to the shoebox appeals that we used to take part in, but instead of a shoebox they use recycled gift bags. For most of the children, this is all they receive, so these gifts are very precious. If you were thinking of having a clear-out before Christmas, we may be able to help each other. Welcome House are looking for any of the following:

- Any spare gift bags, of any size (pre-used is absolutely fine)
- Small toys, cars, dolls and games that your children have grown out of or no longer use,
- Puzzles, colouring books, crayons, felt tips, sweets, bobbles, hair brushes, socks, hats, gloves etc. These do not have to be new, although being in good condition would be good. These children have absolutely nothing when they arrive, so everything is very much appreciated and will make a huge difference.
- Toiletries and hygiene products are also very much sought after for the adults. If you have any unwanted or unused gift sets, or even 'hotel' sized bottles of shampoo/body wash etc., please send them in and we can put them to very good use.

As a school, we would like each class to be able to make up several of these gift bags which we can then pass on to the children at Welcome House. Anything you can contribute would make a huge difference - as well as give you that much needed space back in your cupboards. Please help if you can. Thank you.
