



**Our KS2 Multi-skills sports club** has restarted again on Wednesdays from 3.45 – 4.45pm. This is a club where the children play lots of different sports and games. This week, as they were able to play outside for part of the session, the children were playing tag rugby. The club is held outdoors as much as possible so the children will need to bring outdoor kit with them. They also play games such as bench ball indoors, when the weather is too poor to go outside. There are still some spaces available to children in Years 3 to 6. This club is free to join, so if your child would like to come along, please contact the office to book a place. Children attending last term are welcome to come along again, there is no need to re-sign up to the club.

**Mobile phones** are again causing problems for our older children. While the children feel that they are grown-up enough to manage a mobile phone, many are clearly demonstrating that they are not. Some of the children have posted very personal, mean comments about others, which all the children in the group are aware of. We have discussed how to behave responsibly online and what to do if they see a post or comment that they are unhappy about. Please help us support the children by regularly checking your child's phone content, such as messages, Facebook, What's App, Instagram etc. to make sure that the content they are sending and/or receiving are appropriate.



**Y6** are being visited by the Road Safety Team on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> January. As part of Y6's preparation for transition to secondary school, the team will be delivering a workshop about 'Moving On', which includes travelling on buses.

**Gentle Reminder:** should you have an issue that you would like to discuss, the class teacher is likely to be the person who will be able to answer your questions. The quickest way to make contact is through your child's Seesaw account, or Tapestry in YR. Emails sent to the office often become hidden amongst the hundreds of other emails we receive each day and therefore it can take time to respond to you. Teachers check their Seesaw accounts daily, often just before the school day begins, so can pick up your messages much more quickly and answer your question.
