Our PCSO visited school for a 'walkabout' at lunchtime today. This is to enable the children to get to know her and find out about the role of the PCSO. It is also to help the children build trust in the police and feel able to talk about any concerns or worries about anything that may be happening around them, e.g. in the park at weekends.



As part of our work on the curriculum, we are working to develop the children's understanding of the different skills and knowledge involved in the study of each subject. We explained this in our assembly this morning and have invited the children to design a poster to explain what it means to be an artist. We need the children to use the text, "We are artists because we are..." then use the terms creative, imaginative, expressive." We hope to repeat this for all the subjects and fill our walls with colourful, vibrant work that explains what our children are learning.
