Can you help improve our funding? Might you be eligible for Free School Meals? Children who qualify for Free School Meals also generate additional funding for the school. This is called pupil premium and is worth £1400 per child. We use this funding to support the children in school, in a variety of ways, e.g. classroom support or help with school visit costs. As you are aware, school budgets are extremely tight and every additional piece of funding is much needed. Please check and see if you can make a claim.



Your children will be entitled to free school meals if you, as the parent, are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- Job Seeker's Allowance (income-based)
- Income Support
- Universal Credit - Your annual income assessed by the Department for Work and Pension must be less than £7,400. Any pupil eligible for free school meals before 1 April 2018 when the earned income threshold is introduced will retain their eligibility until then end of universal credit roll-out which is March 2025
- Child Tax Credit (but NOT receiving Working Tax Credit) – provided your annual income, assessed by the Inland Revenue, does not exceed £16,190
(Please note: this amount is subject to change in April every year)
- Employment Support Allowance (income-related)
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

If you think you can make a claim, there is an online form to complete on the East Riding Council website. Please contact the office if you need any help.

Art Club will begin after school on Thursday 21st September. This is open to all KS2 children initially but we may have to review this depending on numbers. There is a small cost of £5 per term for materials. We will set this up on School Money after the first club has taken place.



Hull University have invited us to take part in the **Chinese Whispers** project. This is for children in Y4 and Y5 and will consist of an after school club, where the children will learn about Chinese culture and language through singing and practical activities. This will end in a performance at the University. Mrs Daubney has spoken with the children today and they are very excited. Letters with more details will be coming home next week.

Hull FC will continue to offer their after school **multi-sports club for KS2** on Wednesdays from 3.45 – 4.45pm. This is a free club but places are limited and will be capped at 20. If your child would like to attend, please send a text to the office and the first 20 replies will be offered a place for the first half term. The children will need to bring a kit to change into after school. They will also run a lunchtime rugby club for **Y2 initially**. Y1 will be given the opportunity to join later in the year.
