



A huge well done to the children who took part in the cross country event this week. 45 of our children, the biggest number ever, took part and they were all fantastic. It was a very long way to run but everyone completed the course. Each and every person showed lots of determination, resilience and great team work! 8 of our children qualified to attend the East Riding final and have received letters containing details of when and where these will take place. Mrs Owen & Mr Hood would also like to say a big thank you to all the parents for their support and encouragement of all the children during the races.

We have an outbreak of impetigo in school, particularly in Y1. Impetigo is a skin infection that is very contagious but not usually serious. It often gets better in 7 to 10 days if you get treatment. Anyone can get it, but it is very common in young children. I have attached a letter from East Riding Public Health which gives further information and advice on what to do if someone in your family develops symptoms.
