



We have several bugs in school at the moment, including covid, sickness, coughs and headaches. If your children appear under the weather, please keep them at home until they are well again; this helps limit infection. Likewise, if your children become too unwell to cope in school, we will contact you and ask you to collect them. We do not do this lightly as we would much prefer the children to be in school and learning. However, sometimes we do have to send children home and we appreciate your support with this. I would also like to remind you of the 48-hour rule which applies when children are suffering from stomach bugs. The children need to be away from school until they have been free of episodes of sickness or diarrhoea for 48 hours. This is not just a rule for our school, but a national timescale from DfE, NHS and our local Public Health Team and is there to help stop the spread of infection.

Please do not swear, shout or be aggressive towards any of our staff. Behaving in this way could lead to you being banned from entering the school grounds. We understand that sometimes situations can be frustrating but we are doing our best to help everyone. If you have an issue, please contact us so we can discuss the problem.
