Lunch prices are changing at the start of the spring term. As I explained in the letter I emailed to all parents earlier this week, due to increased food and energy costs, we are running at a loss with our current price and cannot subsidise this from our school budget.

Unfortunately, we have no alternative but to increase the costs of meals to the local authority recommended price of £2.60 from 9th January.
